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**ÉNERGIE SAGUENAY FILES ITS PROJECT DESCRIPTION
WITH GOVERNMENT AUTHORITIES**

Saguenay (Quebec), Wednesday, November 10th, 2015 – The Energie Saguenay Project has submitted its Project Description to the Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency (CEAA) and the Quebec Ministry of Sustainable Development, Environment, and the Fight against Climate Change (MDDELCC). This submittal launches the environmental assessment process, a key milestone in securing the necessary authorizations for a Natural Gas Liquefaction Complex in the Saguenay Region of Quebec. The Liquefaction Complex is slated to produce an estimated 11 million tonnes of Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) per year.

This milestone was achieved after many months of preparation including validating the initial technical and commercial viability of the project and holding numerous information and consultation activities with local decision-makers and the general public. During the environmental assessment process, GNL Quebec (GNLQ) will continue to inform and consult with the population and organizations who share an interest in the project. GNLQ wants to hear the concerns, ideas and observations of the community regarding the project, and to discuss acceptable and adapted mitigation measures.

Two Advisory Committees have already been created, one with the First Nations concerned, and a second will monitor the development of the LNG complex project. A third committee will be formed in the near future to address marine transportation. “GNLQ considers important the implementation of effective and relevant communication channels throughout the development of this unique LNG project,” said GNL Quebec President, Michel Gagnon. Other activities will also be held during the environmental assessment process, with a view to keeping stakeholders and communities abreast of the project.
