

**LANDS REQUIRED FOR THE
ENERGIE SAGUENAY PROJECT**

Saguenay, September 7, 2017 - Given recent speculation about the lands required for the Energie Saguenay Project, GNL Quebec would like to clear up a few points. GNL Quebec does not expect to need additional lands, other than those already identified, for the development of its liquefaction complex. Furthermore, the lands slated for use are owned by the *Administration Portuaire du Saguenay* (APS) (Saguenay Port Authority).

GNL Quebec and APS concluded a long-term lease option in 2013. The positioning scheme for the plant was optimized, meaning that the option considers additional lands, which were acquired by APS in 2015. Once the engineering work for the plant has moved forward, GNL Quebec will be able to return the unused lands to APS. In brief, the lease option between APS and GNL Quebec cover an area that is greater than what will be required for the implementation of the complex. No further expansion projects are planned.
